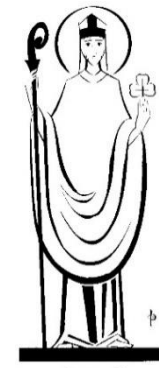

Everyone is welcome to attend the event.

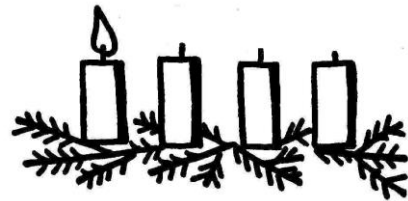
MINI VINNIES' AFTERNOON TEA

SAINT OF THE WEEK: ST NICHOLAS

Many Legends have arisen out St Nicholas who was the bishop of Myra in present-day Turkey. After his death his bones were taken to Bari in Italy and became a focus of prayer for people who were seeking healing. He became known as the "wonder-worker". Last century St Nicholas (Santa Claus) inspired our present-day view of Father Christmas. The tangerines associated with him hark back to his kindness in giving pieces of gold to the poor; and the toffee walking stick (candy cane) is a reference to his bishop's crozier. He died about the year 330. His feast-day is on Thursday.
