## CAFOD D.E.C. APPEAL

In Mozambique, CAFOD workers have brought vital food supplies to the remote area of Buzi where at least 50 families, having lost everything, are sheltering in the local parish church. Over 30,000 people here are receiving basic food, sanitation and shelter supplies

In Eastern Zimbabwe, beyond Chimanimani, an estimated 16,000 people are homeless and in need of shelter. Access to the area is extremely difficult as many roads and bridges were swept away during the storm. Using 4x4 vehicles, CAFOD is distributing water purification tablets but food supplies are urgently needed.

Thanks to your generosity we have so far been able to donate £401.71 from parishioners to the Appeal – the cheque is already on its way to CAFOD.

On Good Friday there will be an ecumenical service at St Peter's, Priorslee at 2pm – *An Hour before The Cross*.

### HOLY WEEK SERVICES

This week we follow the events of the last few days in the earthly life of Jesus – his suffering and death, and then his glorious resurrection.

### PASSION (PALM) SUNDAY



Today we begin Holy Week with the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem when the people welcomed him as their King and their Messiah – but this king's crown would be thorns, and his throne would be the cross.

Palms are blessed and distributed at each of our Masses. Masses are at the usual Sunday times.

### HOLY WEDNESDAY

On Wednesday the clergy of the Diocese will join the Bishop in St Anthony's Church at Wythenshawe to celebrate the Mass of the Chrism. Priests renew their priestly promises, and the oils for use this coming year in parishes will be blessed and consecrated – the Oil of Baptism, the Oil of the Sick, and the Oil of Chrism. It is always a very special Mass. Our parishes will be represented. You can follow it on-line (the diocesan website). All are invited to join at Mass which begins at 7.00pm.



The parish's own newly-blessed Oils will be in Our Lady's church at Thursday night's Mass.

### MAUNDY THURSDAY

In the washing of the feet at today's Mass we remember the service to one another commanded us by Jesus.

As the disciples joined Jesus in the Upper Room, so we join together for our fraternal meal – the Mass – when we shall commemorate the Last Supper the night before Jesus died, when the Lord gave us the sacrament of love and unity. The Mass of the Lord's Supper is at 7.00pm in Our Lady's Church. The Mass will be followed by a time of Watching at the Altar of Repose.

### GOOD FRIDAY

Friday's Liturgy is absolutely unique – there is nothing quite like it throughout the whole year. The subject that occupies the Church today is the death of her



Lord – so it is a sense of mourning that predominates. Yet the texts of the Service show again and again that the death of Christ is not to be separated from his resurrection. It is viewed against Christ's triumph – it is a *celebration*. Our Lady's parish has an ecumenical service "*An Hour before the Cross*" at St Peter's, Priorslee at 2.00pm; at St Patrick's the Solemn Liturgy begins at 3.00pm. The Polish community has its own celebration this day.

### HOLY SATURDAY

The Church, as it were, enters the tomb with the Lord, as it awaits the resurrection. No sacraments are celebrated today.

### THE EASTER VIGIL

The Lent Services and the Holy Week services prepare us to celebrate the resurrection of the Lord, the greatest feast of the Church. In the Vigil we recall how God formed a people to be his own; how he saved that people not only in the past but even now; we celebrate our Baptism – how we form that People today. The Lord will again pass among his People: he will come into our hearts and share with us his new, risen life.




The Vigil must be celebrated after sunset – so we shall celebrate the Vigil at 8.00pm, this year at St Patrick's Church. The Vigil will be a joint English-Polish language celebration enabling our two different communities to come together to celebrate the resurrection.

### EASTER SUNDAY MASSES

Our parish Easter celebrations continue with the other Masses on Easter Day. We renew our Baptismal Promises, and in doing so align ourselves with the Risen Life of Christ.

Each of our Easter morning Masses are at the usual times. So too with the Polish Mass that begins at its normal time of 5.00pm.
