You are asked to still make a booking for a place at one of the **weekend Masses**, please phone the Parish Office on 01952 242423 **BETWEEN 9.00AM AND 11.00AM, MONDAY TO FRIDAY**. The answerphone may be on after those hours – leave a message – we will get back to you. You can always email us on ccntelford@gmail.com to make a booking.

There is no longer a need to book a place at one of our **weekday Masses**. Turn-up; add your name to the Attendance List; and choose a seat, safe distancing from others.

Hand sanitizer and face coverings will continue to be required at all times in church.

The Distribution of Holy Communion has reverted to its pre-2020 place during Mass. As far as possible, Communion will be distributed at the top of each aisle. Continuing restrictions mean we cannot offer the chalice yet, and Communion must be received in the hand and not the tongue. **Having received Communion, people return to their seats for the concluding parts of the Mass.**

As soon as we can, we are also planning to resume tea and coffee after our Sunday Masses at both churches. The kitchen at Our Lady's will have to be inspected by Health and Safety people from Telford & Wrekin before we can use the kitchen facilities.

Ideally, the phone needs to be unlocked from previous networks and have the previous owner's Google or Apple iPhone account deleted from the phone.

JOINT MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL AND PARISH FINANCE COMMITTEE

Despite the United Kingdom having one of the highest COVID infection rates, we are learning to live with the pandemic and things are easing to the "New normal".

They will meet on Monday, 1st November in St Patrick's Meeting Room. SYNODAL CHURCH: COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION, MISSION

A two-year 'synodal' process is taking place in the Catholic Church from October 2021 that culminates in the final Synod Gathering of Bishops in Rome in October 2023. The Pope will launch the process with a special Mass in St Peter's, Rome this Sunday.

Next Sunday, Bishop Mark and all the bishops of England and Wales launch it with a special Pastoral Letter. Parish meetings for reflection and prayer and our deanery (Missionary Area) will need to be submitted by Christmas to the Bishop. More news soon.

NEWS ABOUT LOURDES

For the last two years the diocese has not been able to arrange its annual Pilgrimage to Lourdes because of the COVID restrictions. However, we have heard in the last few days, that plans are being drawn-up for the 2022 Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes. The dates are: for those travelling overland – departure will be on Thursday, 28th July, arriving home on Friday, 5th August 2022; for those travelling by air – departure will be on Friday, 29th July, arriving home on Thursday, 4th August 2022. As soon as more information is received it will be available to parishioners.

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, "Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"
