GREEN ENERGY AND CARBON FOOTPRINT

The electricity which will be supplied from 1st July is from wholly renewable sources, namely wind, wave and solar. This means that we are living out what Pope Francis called us to in *'Laudato Si'*, in minimising our impact on the Earth's resources in how our power is generated, and contributes significantly to lowering the carbon footprint of the Diocese.

THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

When you enter a church no one expects you to leave your brain at the front door. But today's gospel is a reminder that faith is not something for clever people who can argue the finer points of theology. Jesus's promise is for anyone whose heart is open enough to listen to what God is saying.

SAINT BENEDICT

Benedict is one of the patron saints of Europe. He was born in Nursia, northern Italy, of a noble family. In his earlier years he went off to be a hermit in a cave near Subiaco. He gathered disciples and founded a monastery at Monte Cassino. The monks lived a shared life, everyone working but no one owning possessions. Their motto became "Ora et Labora" ("Pray and Work"). Benedict wrote a guide to living as a monk which was called the Rule of Life. After his death in 547 others used his Rule to regulate their own communities, thus earning him the title of "Father of Western Monasticism".

We celebrate his memory and feast-day on Tuesday of this week.
