ST JOHN PLESSINGTON

Born near Blackburn in 1637, he studied for the priesthood in France and Spain. He served at Holywell in north Wales, but was arrested in the Wirral and was martyred in Chester in 1637 by being hanged, drawn and quartered. He was buried in Burton churchyard in the parish of St Winifride's, Neston. He is venerated as being one of our own diocesan martyrs.
