COMMUNION UNDER BOTH KINDS

As restrictions are being lifted the Church now feels that we can return to the practice of receiving communion from the chalice – the precious blood of Christ. In early September ministers will once again assist with communion. Proper hygiene precautions will of course be exercised. Further instruction will follow.

Week-day liturgies will resume the practice in August.

It is assumed that current Ministers will continue in the role. Anyone who would like to become an extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist should add their name to the list on the notice board. Anybody who is Confirmed can be trained for this Ministry. New rotas will be prepared in time for September.

After eighteen years as parish priest at Wellington (and more recently also as parish priest at Trench) and having reached the age of 75 years, **Fr Alban** is retiring this summer. He will live in Trench, where he can be of help to the local priests and parishes. His place will be taken by **Fr Ravi Bosco**, who is currently the parish priest of The Divine Saviour Parish in Runcorn – a large parish which serves three churches and three primary schools.

Fr Tony Elder, who was parish priest at St Paul's in Dawley some years ago, will also be retiring this summer.

The moves take place at the start of September.
